The COVID-19 Pandemic made 2020 an especially difficult year for our existing clients as well as many others who found themselves in need of our services for the first time. Our client base increased as the hardships grew more widespread. CCAP/L&F responded with assistance of food, rent, utilities, prescription co-pays, transportation and even work clothing and footwear for those able to find new employment. We increased food visits from 10 to 12 per year, worked with our community partners, and even developed a new partnership with the Faith Community Coalition for the Homeless to provide bags of food to individuals and families given temporary shelter by FCCH.

As we move into the Winter of 2021 the Pandemic rages on, taking its toll on lives and livelihoods.
